

Would giving teachers guns help protect schools from shooters?

Mass shootings happen in the United States more than in other countries. Last week, a shooter took 17 lives at a high school in Florida. People are now talking about how to better protect schools. Some want teachers to carry guns.

President Trump may support that idea. Some states are considering the idea as well.

Randi Weingarten is the leader of a large group of teachers. The group supports the needs of teachers. Weingarten said that arming teachers with handguns is a bad idea. The attackers often use much stronger guns. She instead wants to see those guns outlawed.

Other groups are also against the idea. One group trains school resource officers. This group does not think teachers could be trained to stop a shooter.



NRA Says Yes To Guns For Teachers

Wayne LaPierre is the leader of the NRA. The powerful group supports gun ownership.

The NRA wants teachers to carry guns. LaPierre thinks schools are not protected enough.

Some state lawmakers are considering new laws. They think that certain teachers should have guns. Teachers who were once in the military are an example.

California has taken the opposite position. Nonsecurity workers in California schools cannot carry guns on campus.

The public is also split on the idea. Almost half of Americans believe teachers with guns could have prevented the Florida shooting.

Parents Are Split On The Issue

Kasey Hansen is a teacher in Utah. She has a gun. She got the idea to arm herself after a shooting in Newtown, Connecticut. In that instance, 20 children and six adults died.

Tara Bordeaux is a teacher in Austin, Texas. She is comfortable with guns. However, she has doubts about her ability to use one in a school setting. "I don't have any instincts in me to be an officer of the law," she said. "My instincts are to be a teacher."

Brock Cartwright is a school leader in Claude, Texas. His district allows teachers to carry guns. Cartwright said armed teachers are just one part of a larger safety plan. They do emergency drills. They also work on better building security.

Parents are on both sides of the issue. Some think armed teachers would prevent schools from being targeted. Others think more guns are not the solution.
